She was to have given lecture Wednesday night at came here from Portage Saturdi She had not been well thou was not thought to be in u usual health. To day she wa engaged in her usual occupatio: She was taken with a sinkir spell and told her husband sl was dying In a few moment st was dead. She was 57 years age and had been giving le tures in this part of the stat

June 17, 1900, The Badger, p. 1, col. 5, Evansville,

Belle Boyd, the rebel spy, who gave an entertainment here a short time since and made this city her home for a time, died suddenly of heart disease at Kilbourn City on Monday night.
