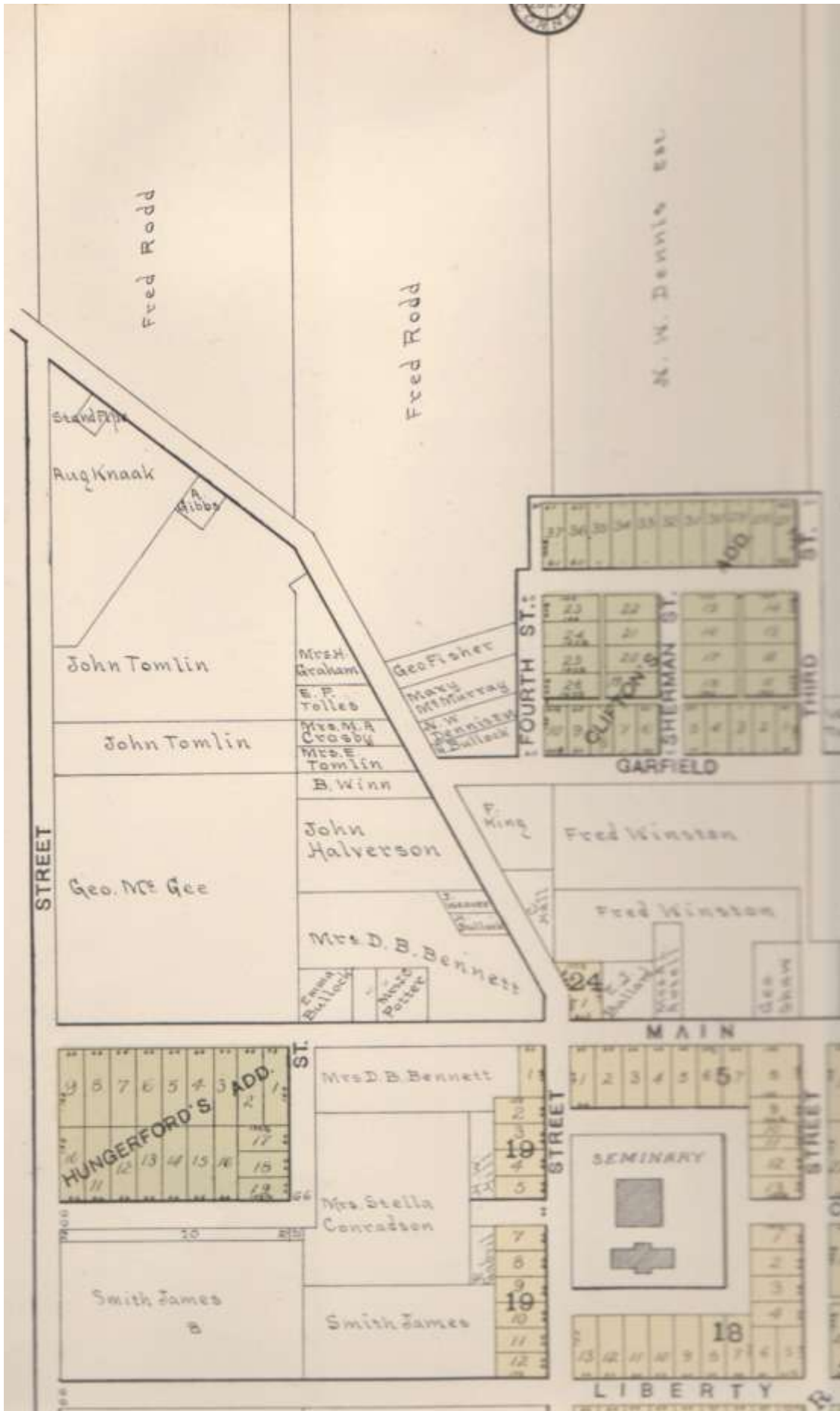

Mrs. Mary Jane Mason died in Enfield, Conn., last Saturday morning, May 13, 1905.

The deceased went East last fall to pay a visit to relatives and friends, and relatives here received a letter stating that she was slightly indisposed which would delay her starting for home. On Sunday a telegram was received announcing her death. The remains, accompanied by a relative, arrived in this city Tuesday evening, and the funeral was held from her late home on West Main Street on Wednesday afternoon at one o'clock. The remains were laid at rest by the side of her husband in the Rutland cemetery.

The deceased was about seventy years of age and for many years resided on a farm in the town of Rutland. Since the death of her husband she has lived in this city. She leaves two sisters, Mrs. Manning of Austin, Minn., and Mrs. Emily Bullock.
