


Mr. G. Cnare a merchant tailor of Madison has established himself in business in Magee's building next door above the furniture store.

A new front will soon adorn the front of Mr. Cnare's tailor shop. The carpenter commenced tearing out the old one yesterday.

April 7, 1885, Enterprise, Evansville, Wisconsin

G. Cnare, merchant tailor, 125 E. Main Street, residence, same. 1900-01 City directory. (note: Magee's Opera House was 121 E. Main in the same directory)

Godfrey Cnare left this Friday morning for Dixon, Ill., where he will go into the merchant tailoring business.

March 5, 1901, the Tribune, p. 3, col. 5, Evansville, Wisconsin

Mr. Godfrey Cnare, who has been engaged in the tailoring business here several years, took his departure Tuesday, for Dixon, Ill., where he will engage in the same business with his brother Frank. We should think this left a grand, good opening for a tailoring establishment here.

1944 Jul - DIXON, IL TAXES - Godfrey Cnare 135 - Personal Property [\$135.?] - per Dixon Evening Telegraph, Dixon, IL, 10 Jul 1944, Pg 6 - via Ancestry.com NOTE: Godfrey is listed in the Newspaper for Property Taxes almost every year in July I didn't copy them all to this posting.

1945 Oct 13 - RETIRES - Godfrey Cnare retires. Article has picture and brief bio. - per The Dixon Evening Telegraph, Dixon, IL, Sat, 13 Oct 1945. pg 3.

1945 May 5, Sat - OBITUARY - "Frank Cnare, 67, who for over 40 years was associated with a brother, Godfrey, in the tailoring business in Dixon, passed away at his home, 1204 First Street, at 8:00 o'clock Friday evening after an illness of about three weeks' duration. Funeral services will be held at the Jones funeral home at 9:00 o'clock monday morning and at St. Patrick's Catholic church at 9:30, with burial in Oakwood Cemetery.

Besides his wife, he is survived by three brothers, Godfrey Cnare, of Dixon; George Cnare of Milwaukee, Wis., and Adam Cnare of Madsion, Wis., and two sisters, Mrs. Tillie Lyon and Mrs. Teney Dick, both of Madison, Wis. A son preceded him in death." - per Dixon Evening Telegraph, Dixon, IL, 5 May 1945 - via Ancestry.com

1953 Feb 18 - OBITUARY - "Mrs. Emma Cnare: Mrs. Emma Cnare, 90, of 1410 Second st., died at 9:30 p.m. Tuesday in KSB hospital after a long illness. She had been a Dixon resident most of her life. She is survived by her widower, Godfrey.

Services will be at 2 p.m. Friday in Jones funeral home. The Rev. Adam Lutzweiller will officiate. Burial will be in Oakwood cemetery." - per The Dixon Evening Telegraph, Dixon, IL, Wed, 18 Feb 1953, Pg 6

1953 Feb 19 - DEATH ARTICLE - "DIXONITE DIES 28 HOURS AFTER WIFE SUCCUMBS: a Dixon Man died this morning approximately 28 hours after the death of his wife in KSB hospital. Godfrey Cnare, 93, of 410 W. Second st., died at 2 a.m. today also in KSB hospital. His wife, Emma, 90, died at 9:30 p.m. Tuesday. Both had been suffering from long illnesses.

Mr. Cnare had been a tailor in Dixon for approximately 40 years. He was born in Germany. There are no immediate survivors." - per The Dixon Evening Telegraph, Dixon, IL, Thurs., 19 Feb 1953, Pg 8.
