



MRS. NELSON EVERSON PASSES TO BEYOND

The death of Mrs. Nelson Everson took place Thursday, May 20, following a painful illness lasting several months.

Her maiden name was Emily Rodgers. She was born in Rock county, January 14, 1847. On January 2, 1864 she was united in marriage with Nelson Everson. To this union there were born three children, two of them dying in infancy. She is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Ella Howard. Her husband preceded her in death about five years ago. She leaves one grandson, Don Howard, and one great grandson, Walter Howard, and one brother, Daniel Rodgers, one half-brother, Charles Everson, and two half-sisters, Mrs. W. B. Van Wart of New Mexico, and Mrs. H. A. Shreve of this city.

The funeral was held at the home on Saturday afternoon and was conducted by the Rev. Chas. E. Coon of the Methodist Episcopal church. Mrs. Everson was laid to rest in the family lot in Maple Hill cemetery, beside the body of her husband.

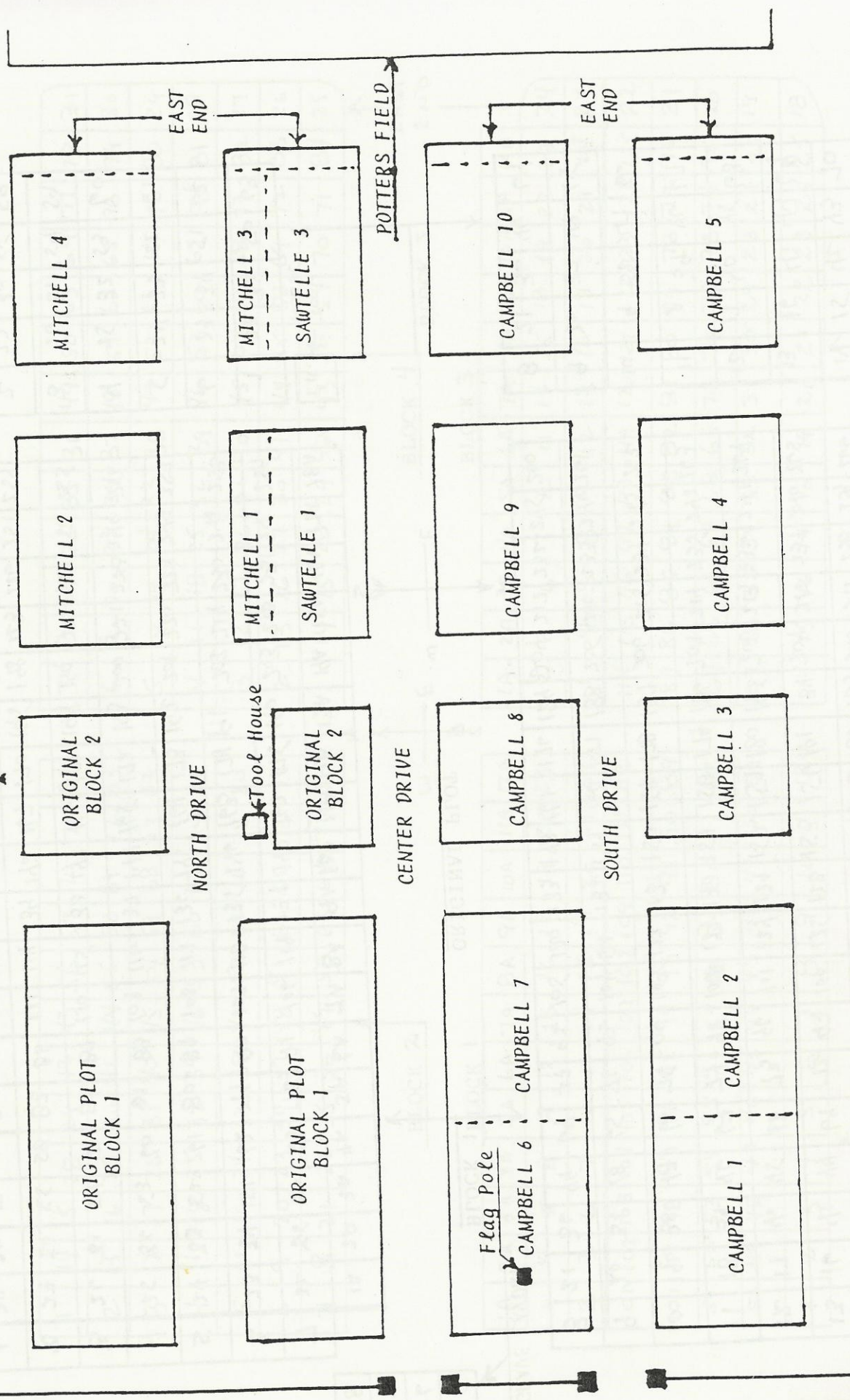
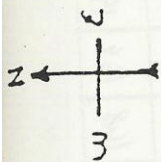

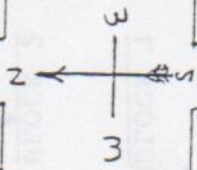
