

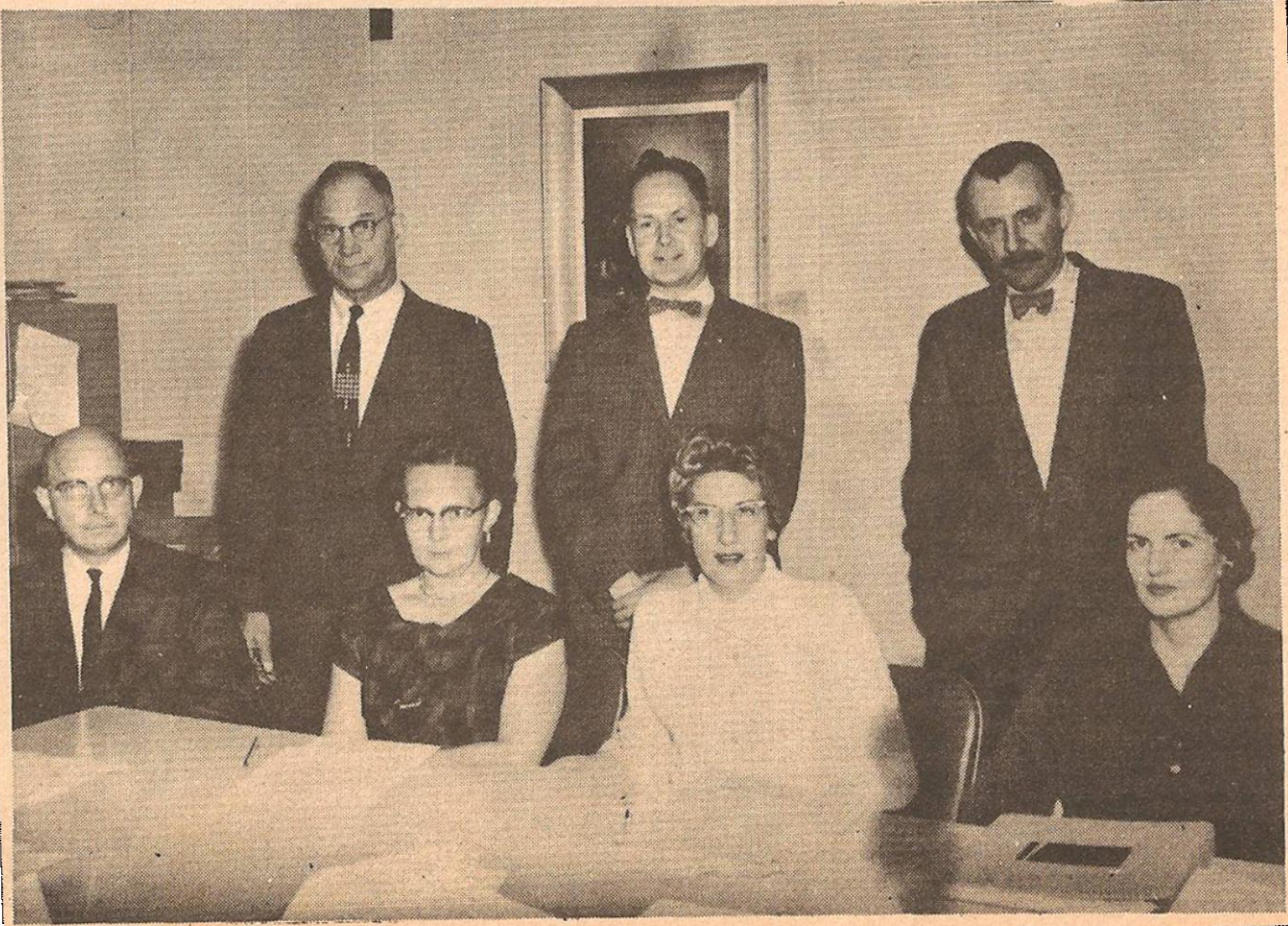

Kenneth A. Ellis, age 69, of Rt. 1, Evansville, died Wednesday, Dec. 24, 1986, at UW Hospital, after a tenacious battle with Leukemia for 16 years.

He was born on May 4, 1917 in Union Township, Rock County, the son of Arthur W. and Maude (Thomas) Ellis. He graduated from Brooklyn, Wisconsin schools and attended the University of Wisconsin, Madison. He was a veteran of WWII, where he served as First Lt. in the Army Air Corps as flying instructor at Foster Field in Victoria, Texas.

He married Ann Karlo on April 12, 1944 and after discharge from service in 1945, he settled in Evansville where he was employed in the engineering department of Baker Mfg. Co., until becoming plant superintendent of the newly formed Pruden Products Co., which later became Varco-Pruden.

Mr. Ellis formed his own company, Treasures Ltd. in Brooklyn in 1971. He was a charter member and past president of the Evansville Golf Assn.; past chairman of the American Welding Society of the Madison-Beloit Section; a member of Mississippi Council of Boy Scouts; Experimental Aircraft Assn.; the American Legion; and an amateur radio operator. He was a member of St. Paul Catholic Church, Evansville.

Surviving are his wife, Ann; five children, Alan of Cold Bay, Alaska, Ginny (David) Widrick of St. Charles, IL, Roger (Janet) of Portage, and Bill of Madison; five grandchildren; and two brothers, Eldon (Viola) of Brooklyn, and Arthur (Lois) of Green Lake, WI.

Funeral services were held at 1:30 pm. Sunday at St. Paul's Catholic Church, with Father Thomas Lourim officiating. Burial was in Mount Hope Cemetery, Brooklyn. Friends called from 3 to 7 pm. Saturday at the Ward Funeral Home, Evansville, where a prayer service was held at 6:30 pm.
